Trail Details

Open dawn to dusk.

Trail length: 7 miles of trails (.8 miles paved)

Surfacing: Mixture of dirt surface, gravel, asphalt.

Accessibility: Trail width varies from 2 feet to 5 feet-wide. The elevation ranges from flat to rolling terrain.

Directions to Parking Lots & Trailheads

HWY 525 Trailhead

(Pacific Dogwood)

- Located at the intersection of HWY 525 and Pacific Dogwood Lane (0.9 miles north of Mutiny Bay Road).
- Parking lot accommodates up to 12 passenger vehicles (under 22' in length).
- Trailer parking is not allowed.

Smugglers Cove Trailhead

- Located 1 mile south of South Whidbey State Park on Smugglers Cove Road.
- The trailhead is on the east side of the road, between Bald Eagle Way and Rhodie Lane.
- Parking lot accommodates horse trailers, buses and RVs.

Bounty Loop Trailhead (ADA Accessible)

- Located on the northwest corner of Bounty Loop Road (off Mutiny Bay Road).
- With multiple handicapped accessible parking spaces, the lot holds 8 passenger vehicles (under 22' in length).
- The short and level ADA accessible trail loop is closed to bikers and horseback riders.
- Trailer parking is not allowed.
