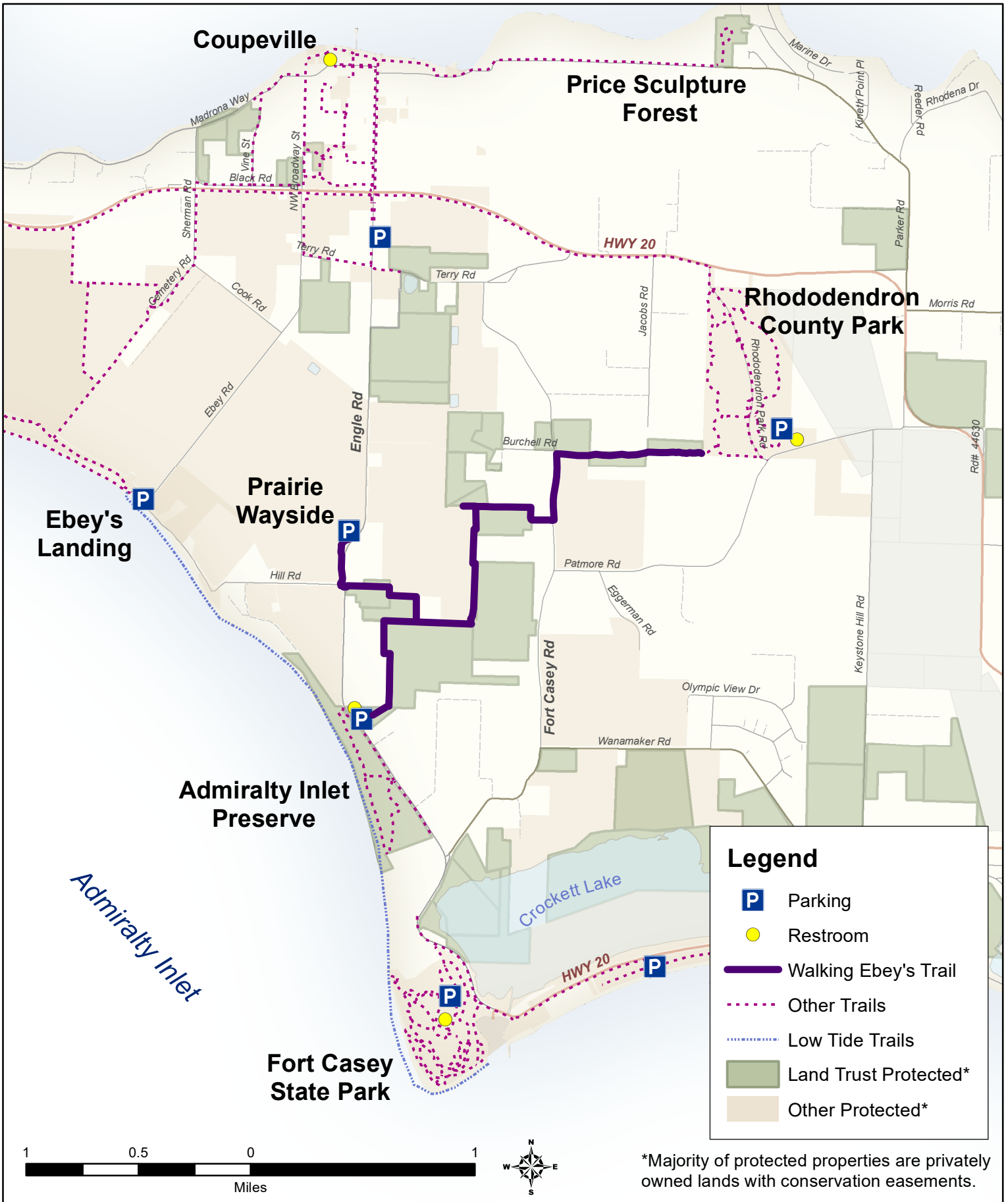



Walking Ebey's Trail System

Walking Ebey's Trail System

Trail Overview

A panoramic, pastoral view awaits you on this first phase of the Walking Ebey's Trail System. To the west, across the waters of Admiralty Inlet, loom the mighty Olympic Mountains. Volcanic, snow-capped Mount Baker dominates the eastern horizon. And in all directions stretch a vast, colorful expanse of picturesque farms interspersed with forests.

This trail crosses privately-owned agricultural lands. Avoid all farm equipment and animals, including guard animals. No approaching, petting or feeding animals.



KEEP THE TRAIL OPEN – RESPECT PRIVATE PROPERTIES BY OBEYING ALL RULES.

Trail Details

Surfacing: Mixture of dirt surface, gravel, mowed paths and wood boardwalks.

Accessibility: Trail width varies from 2 feet to 4 feet-wide. Be Alert! Certain locations require crossing roads with fast moving vehicles. There is a staircase located just east of Fort Casey Road. See our website for more information.

Bus/Bike: Island Transit's Route 6 goes by both the Admiralty Inlet and Prairie Wayside parking lots. There is a bike rack located 0.3 miles south, across the street at the Admiralty Inlet Preserve.

Directions to Parking Locations

Admiralty Inlet

From Coupeville on HWY 525

- Turn south on Main Street
- Parking entrance on left in 2.4 miles
- Port-a-Potty seasonally available

Prairie Wayside

From Coupeville on HWY 525

- Turn south on Main Street
- Parking entrance on right in 1.6 miles

Rhododendron Park

From Greenbank on HWY 525

- Turn left onto Patmore Road
- Park entrance in 0.5 miles
- Drive to the end parking lots
- Port-a-Potty seasonally available
