

Admiralty Inlet Natural Area Preserve

Trail Overview

Located within Ebey's Landing National Historical Reserve, this 86-acre preserve offers old-growth forest, rare prairies, birds and stunning views of the Olympic Mountains, Admiralty Inlet, and the beach below.

The loop trail is open to the public for walking and nature enjoyment. The two prairies feature the beautiful and rare golden paintbrush, which at one point had only 12 populations left in the wild, two of which were at this preserve.

Enjoy view points and interpretive signs along the route to appreciate scenic landscapes and learn more about this preserve and the surrounding areas.

Permitted Uses

Trail Details

Open dawn to dusk.

Trail length: 2.3 miles with loop trail options

Surfacing: Mixture of dirt surface, gravel, wood steps.

Accessibility: Trail width varies from 2 feet to 5 feet-wide. The elevation is mostly flat with one set of stairs.

Bus: Seasonal bus service via Island Transit - Central Whidbey Parks Route.

Bike: Bike rack available at preserve.

Directions to Parking Lot & Trailhead

From Coupeville on HWY 525

- Turn south on Main Street
- Continue on S Engle Road
- Parking entrance on the left in 2.4 miles
- Safely walk across S Engle Road to access trail

From Keystone Ferry Landing on State Route 20

- Head west on State Route 20
- Continue on S Engle Road
- Parking entrance on the right in 1.6 miles
- Safely walk across S Engle Road to access trail

Port-a-potty available year-round.
